2. Historical breadth requirement: 2 seminars dealing with material predating 1800
3. Language requirement: 2 seminars in a secondary language and 1 seminar in a tertiary language
4. Comparative literature requirement: At least 4 seminars must be LTCO courses. Those used to fulfill primary literature, secondary literature or tertiary literature must be substantially focused upon the relevant language and deal with materials in the original.
